INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This report outlines the performance of the Bury East Township Forum and the progress on each of the themes contained within the Bury East Township Action Plan for 2012-13. The information provided has been gathered from a number of qualitative and quantitative sources including Bury Insight, Index of Multiple Deprivation, Area Profile Data and various local community intelligence sources.
- 1.2 There are currently 4 key thematic priorities contained within the Bury East Action Plan for 2012/13:
 - Improved Employment Opportunities
 - Improved Health and Wellbeing
 - Improved Community Safety
 - Improved Community Cohesion & Integration

This report provides a summary of the overall performance for each of the themes and the projects which contribute to their delivery. The report clearly outlines the aims for each theme, along with the projects undertaken and the successes of the forum.

What We Did

- Developed a bid for the £1m Alcohol Prospectus Scheme championed by Baroness Newlove at the Department for Communities & Local Government (DCLG)
- Formed a project group to develop an innovative Participatory Model to engage the communities of Bury East in the funding decision making process
- Worked with key partners to encourage project bids focused on addressing alcohol related anti-social behaviour
- Bury East Partnership Action Groups established to improve partnership response to community safety issues and vulnerable residents

Successes to Date

- £90 funding secured by Township Forum for projects to address alcohol related Anti-social behaviour in Bury East (BEAPS Project)
- Successful Participatory Budgeting event held in Sept 2012 which allocated over £40k to ASB focused partner projects
- Six groups were awarded funding for projects funded through BEAPS to address alcohol related ASB
- Significant and sustained reductions in Juvenile Rowdy Behaviour in Bury East
- Alcohol related ASB has also reduced due to the positive impact of the partner led BEAPS projects
- Established the North Bury Partnership Action Group to review Anti-Social Behaviour (asb) issues, vulnerable victims and high risk perpetrators of asb.
- An action plan is being developed to manage each of the issues and individuals that will be focused on at each Partnership Action Group Meeting.

Areas of Concern/Next Steps

- A&E data proving very difficult to obtain, more work to be completed with New Economy to source outcome evidence
- Continue to develop the North Bury Partnership Action Group

SUMMARY & CONCLUSION

Township Planning Process

During 2012/2013 Bury East Township Forum developed and agreed our Township Plan. The plan identified local issues and priorities where, working together with local councillors, community representatives, groups and residents, they can make a difference. The plans are three yearly plans and include an annual action plan. The action plan incorporates the key projects and actions to be delivered over the coming year to contribute towards delivery of the local priority outcomes.

The Township Plans were developed through active engagement and discussions with Township Forum members - including both councillors and Advisory Group members. 'Round table' discussions were held at the beginning of the 2012 municipal year to provide an opportunity for wider community representatives, partner organisations and residents to get involved in agreeing local priorities. The emerging plans have been presented to public meetings of the Township Forums, providing further opportunities for residents to get involved and shape their local area.

Advisory Group

Over the course of 2012-13 Bury East Township Forum has been well attended by each advisory group member. The Forum has full membership and has benefitted from active participation from each member in the Township Planning process and the delivery of the outcomes identified for each themed priority. The Advisory Group representatives have taken an active lead in updating forum members on key issues from their areas and the work going on to address them, particularly projects that link in with the projects within the Township Plan for Bury East. The development of the new Township Plans for 2013/14 will involve facilitating

round table discussions and advisory group members will each facilitate a themed discussion group focused on identifying the priorities around the theme for the year ahead.

The value of the Township Forums is recognised in major public consultation exercises. During 2012/13 this has included:

- Welfare Reform
- Recycling and waste management updates
- Streetsafe proposed introduction of 20mph zones

Community Fund

The Council continues to allocate £1,000 per ward each year to support the work of voluntary and community groups. Individual grants to the 'ward fund' are available for a maximum of £250. Additionally, a borough-wide allocation of £13,000 is available for 'cross-ward' applications from third sector organisations, with a maximum individual grant of £750. Small grants funds are also available for grants of up to £12,000.
