Statement by Monitoring Officer	Under the Local Authorities (Members Allowances) (England) Regulations 2001, local authorities are required to maintain a panel to make recommendations to the Council about allowances for elected and co-opted members. Before the Council amends an allowance scheme, it must have regard to the recommendations made by the Panel.

6.0 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 The Local Authorities' (Members' Allowances) (England) Regulations 2003 provide that a local authority may make provision in its Scheme for the payment of a cooptees' allowance, for attendance at conferences and meetings, to any co-opted and appointed members of a council's committee or sub-committees..
- 6.2 The Regulations also permit local authorities to pay travel and subsistence allowances and to fix the level of those allowances...
