Two Notices of Motion both relating to Climate Change had been received in accordance with Council Procedure Rule 12:-

It was moved by Councillor V D'Albert and seconded by Councillor Baum that the following motion be approved:-

(A) "This Council notes that:

- 1. Climate change predictions show that without severe cuts in greenhouse gas emissions, the world will be hit by drought, flooding and famine affecting all of us and poorest countries in particular.
 - Some of these countries are already suffering from the effects of climate change. This is an issue of social justice as well as a call to take environmental action.
- 2. Under the UK Climate Change Act 2008 the UK is due to cut its emissions by 34% by 2020, but that, according to climate change scientists, a cut of 10% in 2010 is in line with what is now needed to avert runaway climate change.
- 3. The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, which meets in Copenhagen in December of this year, may be the world's last chance to negotiate a deal that will avert the worst consequences of climate change.
- 4. To ensure a breakthrough at the critical Copenhagen conference government ministers need to know that their public supports more dramatic cuts in emissions than have hitherto been proposed.
- 5. Various councils are among those who have signed up to the "10:10 Campaign" which seeks to persuade individuals, businesses, organisations and the UK government to reduce their CO2 emissions by 10% in 2010.

This Council supports the aims and ambitions of the 10:10 Campaign. This Council therefore resolves to sign Bury Council up for the 10:10 Campaign."

In the names of Councillors Baum, V D'Albert, M D'Albert, Davison, AS Garner, AJ Garner, O'Hanlon, Pickstone and S Wright.

- (i) An amendment was moved by Councillor Boden and seconded by Councillor Cummings by way of the addition of the following paragraph at the end of the above Motion:-
 - "Accordingly, we instruct our officers to undertake, as a matter of urgency, a feasibility study demonstrating how CO2 emissions which result from the Council's own activities can be reduced by 10% by the end of 2010."

Prior to the vote on the amendment, Councillor Connolly and at least seven other Councillors, requested that voting be recorded to show how each Member cast their vote.

In the absence of a majority, the Mayor declared the amendment lost.

(ii) A further amendment was moved by Councillor Bibby and seconded by Councillor Creswell as follows:-

"This Council notes that:

- 1. Climate change predictions show that without severe cuts in greenhouse gas emissions, the world will be hit by drought, flooding and famine affecting all of us and poorest countries in particular. Some of these countries are already suffering from the effects of climate change. This is an issue of social justice as well as a call to take environmental action.
- 2. Under the UK Climate Change Act 2008 the UK is due to cut its emissions by 34% by 2020, but that, according to climate change scientists, a cut of 10% in 2010 is in line with what is now needed to avert runaway climate change.

Add the following sentence:

"However, any cuts to emissions have to be planned for and delivered within an agreed strategy and available resources going forward."

3. The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, which meets in Copenhagen in December of this year, may be the world's last chance to negotiate a deal that will avert the worst consequences of climate change.

DELETE:

"4. To ensure a breakthrough at the critical Copenhagen conference government ministers need to know that their public supports more dramatic cuts in emissions than have hitherto been proposed.

ADD:

"4. To ensure a breakthrough at the critical Copenhagen conference government ministers should properly reflect the concerns of the public and business community to ensure a proper balance is struck when setting climate change targets".

DELETE:

"5. Various councils are among those who have signed up to the "10:10 Campaign" which seeks to persuade individuals, businesses, organisations and the UK government to reduce their CO2 emissions by 10% in 2010."

ADD:

"5. The increasing threat of Climate Change to this and future generations' health and well-being requires the global community to collectively act in concert to combat the damaging effects of climate change to achieve localised changes here in Bury, there is a need to challenge and rethink the way consumers and business move to a low carbon economy in order to not only make a positive contribution to reducing the impact of climate change, but also reduce dependency on external sources of energy."

DELETE:

"This Council supports the aims and ambitions of the 10:10 Campaign. The Council therefore resolves to sign Bury Council up for the 10:10 Campaign."

ADD:

"The Council with its ambitious targets to reduce carbon emissions by 10% by March 2011 along with an overall reduction of 35% in partnership with the Carbon Trust remains the best and most achievable approach in the current climate change debate".

Following the debate, Councillor Connolly moved and Councillor Smith seconded that the question be now put which was accepted by the Council.

The amendment, on being put, with 25 Members voting for and 24 Members against, was declared carried by the Mayor.

The substantive Motion on being put with 25 members voting for and 24 members against, the Mayor declared the Motion carried.

(B) It was moved by Councillor Boden and seconded by Councillor Cummings, that the following Motion be approved:-

"This Council, being mindful of the 10:10 campaign to reduce CO2 emissions by 10% by the end of 2010, notes that 28 local authorities, including the City of Manchester, have signed up to the campaign:

We remind ourselves that the Council is a signatory to the Nottingham Declaration and the North West Climate Change Charter.

Accordingly, we instruct our officers to undertake, as a matter of urgency, a feasibility study demonstrating how CO2 emissions which result from the Council's own activities, can be reduced by 10% by the end of 2010."

The Mayor ruled that, whilst the Council was again considering the final paragraph of this Motion which had been included in the amendment considered in (A)(i) above, she was prepared, on this occasion, to allow that paragraph to remain in the Motion notwithstanding the provisions of the Council Procedure Rules.

The Motion on being put with 24 Members voting for and 24 against with no abstentions was declared lost in the absence of a majority vote.
