At the invitation of the Mayor, Councillor Gartside, Executive Member for Resource (representing Councillor Sullivan, Executive Member for Health and Well Being), made a Statement on the Housing Revenue Account for 2010/2011

It was moved by Councillor Bibby and seconded by Councillor Creswell and on being put with no Member voting against and with the Mayor abstaining, it was:-

That the recommendations contained in Minute EX.638 of the meeting of the Executive held on 24 February 2010 concerning the Housing Revenue Account 2010/2011 be approved and adopted.

(b) Minute EX.639 of the meeting of the Executive held on 24 February 20010- Budget 2010/2011 to 2013/2014

At the invitation of the Mayor, Councillor Gartside, Executive Member for Resource made a statement on the Budget 2010/2011 to 2013/2014

(A) It was moved by Councillor Bibby and seconded by Councillor Creswell that the recommendation contained in Minute EX.639 of the meeting of the Executive held on 24 February 2010, concerning the Budget for 2010/2011 be approved and adopted subject to the following amendment:-

"1. That the report be noted and the Council be requested to consider and determine all matters relating to the Budget, the Capital Programme and the level of the Council Tax for 2010/2011 at its meeting on 24 February 2010."

# "Section A - Capital Programme 2010/11 to 2012/13

1. That the Capital Programme for 2010/11 and future years, shown in Appendix B, be approved subject to the following additions:

- £0.249m in energy efficiency works at

  - Castle Leisure Centre
  - Bury Town Hall and
  - o Bury Market

to be funded from an interest free loan from Salix Finance, via the Carbon Trust, which will be repaid from savings in energy costs resulting from this investment.

- 3. That the risk assessment set out in section 5 of section A of the report be noted and the risk mitigation actions be approved.

- 9. That the Golden Rules set in section 4.3 be reaffirmed subject to the amendment set out in paragraph 4.3.3 increasing within the formula the amount below which the balances cannot fall to £3.5m;
- 10. That the actual minimum level of balances for 2010/11 be increased to £3,800,000;
- 11. That the recommendations of the Schools' Forum around education funding issues set out in section 4.10 be approved;

  - 1. the following amounts be now calculated by the Council for the year 2010/11 in accordance with Sections 32 to 36 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992: -
    - (a) £434,661,300 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 32(2)(a) to (e) of the Act;
    - (b) £293,079,000 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 32(3)(a) to (c) of the Act;
    - (c) £141,582,300 being the amount by which the aggregate at 2(a) above exceeds the aggregate at 2(b) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 32(4) of the Act, as its budget requirement for the year;
    - (d) £66,138,900 being the aggregate of the sums which the Council estimates will be payable for the year into its General Fund in respect of redistributed Non-domestic Rates and Revenue Support Grant, decreased by the amount of the sums which the Council estimates will be transferred in the year from its General Fund to its Collection Fund;
    - (e) £1259.75 being the amount at 2(c) above less the amount at 2(d) above, all divided by the Council Tax Base of 59887.66, calculated by the Council in accordance with Section 33(1) of the Act as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year; and

- 17. That, in accordance with Section 13A of the Local Government Finance Act 1992, the Council will reduce the Bury element of the Council Tax for the year 2010/11 by 3.39% for persons who are:
  - (i) Liable on 1 April 2010 to pay Council Tax either jointly or in their own right by being an owner occupier or tenant of a dwelling within the Bury MBC boundary, which is their sole or main residence;
  - (ii) Aged 65 or over on 1 April 2010 and
  - (iii) Not in receipt of Council Tax benefit on 1 April 2010

For information only - in respect of people falling into the above categories the following amounts will be payable as Council Tax for the year 2010/11 for each of the categories of dwellings shown below:

#### Notes:

- 1. Proposal is to borrow £2m to invest to make Council Buildings (including schools) more energy efficient. This would require £490,000 repayment costs a year for five years, netted off against savings of £350,000 per year in reduced energy bills / consumption. After 7 years this has paid for itself and will deliver additional resources to the Council. The call on the PIR will be the difference between the debt costs and the revenue savings (£140,000).
- 2. Working with Greater Manchester Police, we would provide resources for an additional PCSO in each LAP area, to work with the local police team, but specifically focussed on council and LAP priorities. (£210,000).
- 3. Proposal is to save £300,000 a year from a review of, and further efficiencies in, back office functions and from a de-layering of management."
