1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Under Consolidated Regulations for Local Authority Allowances, Independent Remuneration Panels are established by all Local Authorities to make recommendations about the level of basic allowances for all Members, the level of special responsibility allowances and to whom they should be paid, and on whether dependants' carers' allowance, travel and subsistence allowances and co-optees' allowances should be paid and the levels of these allowances.
- 1.2 The Independent Remuneration Panel was asked to carry out a review of the current Members' Allowance Scheme in the light of imminent constitutional changes.

The report of the Panel, containing its recommendations, is before Members for consideration.
