New Bury Fire Station Update

Capital programme of £1.8 mil. As part of the 'land swap' deal with Bury MBC, the build cost will be £1.6 mil.

Kier North West commissioned for the new build on Castle Croft, behind the new police station. Selected from a short list of 6 contractors who provided tenders. As part of the tendering process, each contractor committed to employ local builders and also apprentices as part of the contracting teams.

Now 18 weeks into the project, which shows real visible signs of progress. To date 4 days slippage has taken place due to bad weather – but the project is still scheduled for completion early June.

It is being billed as a community station; design offering a friendly and accessible frontage. As part of the sustainability strategy it is being built to a high BREEAM (Building Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Method) specification.

Much consultation (some as a formal Future Jobs Fund project) has taken place as to what community activities may take place. Currently ideas range from: caged soccer; internet café; sensory garden; community fitness schemes; youth mentoring; healthy lifestyles schemes; and a range of other ideas. The existing Roc scheme will transfer to the new site.

BREEAM sets the standard for best practice in sustainable building design, construction and operation and has become one of the most comprehensive and widely recognised measures of a building's environmental performance.

Fire Service Corporate Plan - Consultation

Proposals contained in the plan have been widely discussed across a number of stakeholders: fire service staff; 'market stall' event in Bury town centre; Community Safety Portfolio; Citizens Panel at Bury FSHQ; and feedback across the Bury Partnership. Although some elements are apparently contentious (e.g. removal of Ramsbottom's retained appliance), once discussed and explained, most parties have expressed comfort with the proposals. Consultation ended 24th Jan.

Significant Community Safety Initiatives

Roc On the Rock

Redeeming Our Communities (ROC) is about unlocking capacity within communities, utilising partner agencies including GMP and FRSs working together with organisations such as the Street Pastors, volunteers and the Christian Network, doing good within communities and protecting the frontline by utilising people within the community to help. ROC is a national charity, which is committed to working with the police, the fire service, local churches and members of all communities, to drive

down ASB & crime and forge strong community partnerships to create sustained social change for the good of all. The activities provided by the collaboration are for children and young adults from within the Borough. The ROC Café is a multi-agency youth meeting place for secondary age young people from across the borough. The intention is to divert from ASB / Crime by the various agencies / churches and into the ROC Café, where they will engage in various activities and be involved in fun youth-focused projects with mentors from various churches, led by Pastor Stephen Wilkinson (Freedom Church). The ROC Café in Bury is the first Café in the country to be located on Fire Service premises.

BSafe BCool

Following a spate of small fires and anti-social behaviour caused by youths during the summer holidays at Holcombe in Bury, a partnership between the fire & rescue service, police and Bury Council was formed with a specific remit to educate young people and prevent this type of behaviour. The Bsafe, Bcool partnership targeted year 9 pupils in schools across Bury. The project aimed to encourage them to act responsibly in the community through a series of interactive workshops with each Service.

The key topics studied by teenagers were sex, drugs, alcohol, crime, antisocial behaviour, fire and towards the latter end, cyber bullying. The sessions allowed the respective organisations to provide important information to, and strike up a rapport with young people across the borough. To assist in promoting the message, the partnership used the skills of Bury College School of Performing Arts who demonstrated some of the effects of anti-social behaviour through expressive dance.

The sessions allowed pupils from schools across Bury to interact and get involved in discussions around safety and personal responsibility and build relationships with their local neighbourhood police officers, fire service & partners.

Community Interventions - Planned

ADAB – We have recently successfully bid for £30k to fund a project which will assist us in reaching the heart of the ethnic minorities communities, particularly in Bury east, where the deprivation is at it's highest. The money will fund the creation of an Asian volunteer force; a multi language DVD for fire safety in the home education; and the education of the business sector in fire safety regulatory compliance.

Jewish Community

Talks are planned to meet key representatives of the Jewish community. We have links with the Beth Din through Rabbi Brodie who is providing assistance / facilitation. Organisations we wish to work with include: Beth Din; Interlink; The Jewish Representative Council; Hatzola; ZAKA; the Community Safety Team.
