REPORT OF COUNCILLOR MATTHEWS PEPSENTATIVE ON THE GREATER MANCHESTER FIRE AND RESCUE AUTHORITY

New Bury Fire Station Update

Capital programme of £1.8 mil. As part of the 'land swap' deal with Bury MBC, the build cost is £1.6 mil.

Moved in 6th July. Now fully settled in with only minor teething issues to sort out.

It was built as a community station; design offering a friendly and accessible frontage. Examples of community users include: MS Society; NHS Pennine Care; Probation Services; Radcliffe Children's Centre; Redeeming Our Communities; Communities Group; Bury Beekeeping Club; Community consultation exercise; Disabilities Group; Army Cadets; various partnership groups.

As part of the sustainability strategy it has been built to a high BREEAM (Building Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Method) specification.

BREEAM sets the standard for best practice in sustainable building design, construction and operation and has become one of the most comprehensive and widely recognised measures of a building's environmental performance.

Fire Service Corporate Plan - Consultation

Proposals contained in the plan were widely discussed across a number of stakeholders: fire service staff; 'market stall' event in Bury town centre; Community Safety Portfolio; Citizens Panel at Bury FSHQ; and feedback across the Bury Partnership. Changes to crewing at Bury took place 1st April and have not shown any adverse effects to fire cover.

Significant Community Safety Initiatives

Roc On the Rock

The ROC Café in Bury was the first Café in the country to be located on Fire Service premises. It has moved with the new station and we held a public consultation on the premises recently to consider how we might re-shape the use of our facilities.

Bsafe BCool

Following a spate of small fires and anti-social behaviour caused by youths during the summer holidays at Holcombe in Bury, a partnership between the fire & rescue service, police and Bury Council was formed with a specific remit to educate young people and prevent this type of behaviour. The Bsafe, Bcool partnership targeted

year 9 pupils in schools across Bury. The project aimed to encourage them to act responsibly in the community through a series of interactive workshops with each Service.

The key topics studied by teenagers were sex, drugs, alcohol, crime, antisocial behaviour, fire and towards the latter end, cyber bullying. The sessions allowed the respective organisations to provide important information to, and strike up a rapport with young people across the borough. To assist in promoting the message, the partnership used the skills of Bury College School of Performing Arts who demonstrated some of the effects of anti-social behaviour through expressive dance.

The sessions allowed pupils from schools across Bury to interact and get involved in discussions around safety and personal responsibility and build relationships with their local neighbourhood police officers, fire service & partners.

The scheme is now currently running over the next 2 weeks in the Bury secondary schools.

ADAB – We have recently been successful in a bid for to fund a project which will assist us in reaching the heart of the ethnic minorities communities, particularly in Bury east, where the deprivation is at it's highest. We have produced a multi-language DVD for fire safety in the home education and we are in the process of recruiting an Asian volunteer force. We will also be educating the business sector in fire safety regulatory compliance.
