#### 5.0 INTRODUCTION

5.1 On the 18<sup>th</sup> October 2002 the Council made the Metropolitan Borough of Bury (Bentley Hall Road) Tree Preservation Order 2002 under Section 201 of the Town and Country Planning Act. This requires the Order to be confirmed within six months to assure its permanence.

#### 6.0 BACKGROUND

6.1 The tree preservation order was initiated in response to a request from a resident of High Street, Walshaw for the Council to consider protecting a number of trees on land adjacent to the rear of their property. They consider that the land is threatened by possible development that would result in a considerable loss of amenity trees. Whilst the resident did request the protection of a large number of trees, only six of these were considered suitable under the regulations governing the making of tree preservation orders.

#### 7.0 ISSUES

- 7.1 An objection to the making of the order has been lodged by Lambert Smith Hampton on behalf of Walshaw Estates, the owners of the land affected by the preservation order. They object on four counts:
  - 1. The Authority has not served their client correct documents;
  - 2. The trees are not visible from the public domain and do not make a significant contribution to the landscape;
  - 3. One tree species is incorrectly identified;
  - 4. One tree has been damaged by fire, and
  - 5. Two of the trees are of inferior quality.
- 7.2 Counts 1, 3 and 4 have now been addressed. The correct documents have now been served, the species identified correctly on the plan and schedule, and the damaged tree omitted from the order.
- 7.3 With respect to counts 2, and 5 it is evident from the initial request for the order and from subsequent site inspections that the trees are of sufficient quality and amenity value to comply with the requirements of the regulations governing the making of tree preservation orders.

#### 8.0 CONCLUSIONS

8.1 The preservation order was initiated in response to a legitimate concern for the future of trees that provide an amenity value for the residents of High Street, Walshaw. The contents of the order have been reconsidered following the receipt of the objection and amended as appropriate. It is recommended therefore that the preservation order is confirmed in its amended form to give it permanent status.
