#### 5.0 INTRODUCTION

5.1 The Planning Code of Conduct is in need of revision in order to bring it into line with the Council's Code of Conduct for Members, Independent and other voting representatives and to reflect the position of Area Boards in the planning process.

#### 6.0 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 The current Planning Code of Conduct was approved by Council at its meeting on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2001 for the remainder of that municipal year. At the meeting, it was agreed that Ward Councillors should be permitted to speak on applications affecting their Ward at meetings of the Planning Control Committee and that the role of Area Boards in the planning process should be looked at.
- 6.2The Area Board Chairs agreed a protocol for Area Board involvement in planning issues and this has been incorporated in the revised Code for approval.
- 6.3 In addition, the Code has been changed to ensure that it is compatible with the Council's Code of Conduct which was approved by the Council on 10<sup>th</sup> April, 2002.
- 6.4 Major changes to the Planning Code have been set out in bold/italic type for ease of reference.

### 7.0 CONCLUSIONS

7.1 The revised Planning Code will be submitted to the meeting of Council on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2003 for approval.
