**Report**

The Lutyens War Memorial originally located at Wellington Barracks was first listed in September 1992, and grade II.

Following Listed Building Consent approval in January 2009 the memorial was restored and relocated in Gallipoli Gardens as part of the relocation of the Fusiliers Museum. The process of moving the structure required its re-assessment for re-listing by English Heritage.

The obelisk was re-listed, and again grade II, on the 3 October 2011 under the Gallipoli Gardens address.

The justification for listing is -

1. It has strong cultural and historic significance within both a local and national context
2. It forms a poignant reminder of the effects of tragic world events on the local community
3. It was designed by a nationally renowned architect who had a personal connection to the Lancashire Fusiliers regiment.
4. It is a simple yet elegant obelisk design incorporating carved decoration and two life-size, coloured, stone enamelled flags representing the colours of the king and the regiment.

The committee is recommended to note the inclusion of the War Memorial on the List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest for England as Grade II
