		TfGM running Local link service for connectivity to Pilsworth, health centre and Whitefield centre At Township forum 20 <sup>th</sup> Nov 2012 Paul Turner, director of first bus announced The diversion of service 93 via Morrisons and Whitefield Metrolink to be reinstated. This diversion to apply Monday to Saturday daytime i.e the same times as the diversion previously operated on a 30 minute frequency. All journeys on service 94 will become service 92 and be diverted via Pilsworth on a trial basis for 6 months. Pilsworth will be served every 30 minutes Monday to Saturday daytime and hourly evenings and Sundays, We will report on progress against targets between January and July with a view to making this permanent. Service 94 will also operate via Manchester Road rather than Market Street which will continue to be served by the 93. We will continue to review this following requests for both services to use Manchester Road. Additional running time has been added to improve reliability - this will remain under continuous review. We have discussed siting of bus stops at Besses with TfGM to improve interchange with service 135. We are producing posters and flyers promoting the changes and welcome the offers form Township forum members to help distribute these locally. First will be represented at future Township Forum meetings on 8 January and 12 March and future dates to be confirmed- to present publicity and obtain feedback.
