1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations is the relevant legislation.
- 1.2 The Panel will make a decision on the day of the hearing and the parties will be notified subsequently of the decision and the reasons for it by letter from the Licensing Office.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The premises licence holder in respect of these premises is Rontec Watford Limited, 13-14 Esplanade, St Helier, Jersey, JE1 1BD. Mr Sajjad Ahmad, 28 Melling Road, Clarksfield, Oldham is the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 2.2 The applicant has complied with all the necessary procedural requirements laid down by the Act.
- 2.3 As part of the statutory process the Responsible Authorities and interested parties are entitled to make representations in relation to the variation of a premises licence. Where representations are made and not withdrawn Members are required to determine them. Representations have been received from two councillors.
- 2.2 Representations must be relevant to the licensing objectives defined within the Act. The objectives are:-
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety
 - c) prevention of public nuisance and
