THE BRITISH MONARCHY SHOULD BE ABOLISHED

Monarchy is rule by an individual who is royal, and the system is usually hereditary. The term monarchy derives from the Greek, monos arkhein, meaning 'one ruler'.

The British monarch, Queen Elizabeth II, is the Sovereign and Head of State of the UK and its overseas territories. The monarch, referred to in the abstract as 'The Crown', is the source of all legislative and executive power.

Since Henry VIII, the British monarch is also Supreme Governor of the Church of England.

The British monarch is also the Head of the Commonwealth, and the head of state in 16 of the 54 Commonwealth member countries.

The British political system is a 'constitutional monarchy': the supreme power held by the monarch is largely ceremonial and formal, with actual political power exercised by others.

YC.3 MATTERS ARISING

Further to Minute YC.5 of the last meeting of the Youth Cabinet held on 23 March 2015, the Youth Cabinet was presented with a letter that had been written by two of its youth members on behalf of the Cabinet.

Robyn Clegg Gibson reported that the Walking Rainbow would be taking place on Sunday 12 July from 12.30pm.

It was explained that the Walking Rainbow was an annual event which was held to say no to homophobia, promote equality and stand against negatives. The event took the form of a walk from the Town Hall, around the Town Centre and ended at Kay Gardens where information stalls, music and fun would be provided.

Robyn stated that the previous years' Walking Rainbow events had been very successful and well attended and it was hoped that as many of the Youth Cabinet as possible would attend.

YC.5 CIRCLES OF INFLUENCE 2015 - ACTIVITY

It was reported that that secondary/tertiary age Circles of Influence would be taking place on Monday 22 June. The event brought together young people from across the borough and gave them the opportunity to discuss issues relating to them and their peers and question decision makers and officers from all different organisations across the borough.
