#### **RTF.303 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Gill Stainthorpe and Carol Kemp declared a personal interest as members of the Withins Community Association and Radcliffe Heritage Society in relation Agenda Item 8. Funding Panel.

#### **RTF.304 MINUTES**

#### It was agreed:

That the Minutes of the last meeting of the Township Forum held on 22 July, 2015 be approved as a correct record and signed by the Deputy Chair.

#### LOCAL POLICE UPDATE **RTF.305**

PS Mark Reed and PC Phil Flanagan attended the meeting in order to provide an update on key police issues in Radcliffe, as follows:-

• Figures for burglaries in Radcliffe East were down on last year, in Radcliffe North the figures were slightly up (Bradley Fold/Ainsworth Road areas). The police were actively investigating and had increased patrols in this area. The numbers of reported robberies resulting in violence/injury had also decreased slightly (reduction in 18 incidents on last year). In response to a question from Councillor Walker regarding Bradley Fold, the Officers reported that one person had been arrested in connection with a couple of the incidents, however the police suspected that this person would not have been responsible for all of the incidents.

#### Radcliffe Township Forum, 16 September 2015

The police asked for residents to be vigilant and to report any suspicious activity in the area.

- A member of the public informed the meeting that they had arrived for the PACT meeting at 4.45 pm and that no personnel had been present at the Civic Suite at this time. There was no signage on arrival at the Civic Suite regarding the meeting. It was reported that the PACT meeting was scheduled from 5 pm in the Charter Room. Officers were in attendance at this time. An assurance was given that this meeting had been advertised by the police and Council and that, subject to the availability of Officers on the evening of the next Township Forum meeting, they could see no reason why a PACT meeting would not be held prior to the start of the next Township Forum. This would be duly advertised in advance, to include signage on the doors of the venue.
- Police/Fire Fun Day Sunday 20 September at Radcliffe Borough FC, Stainton Rd, from 11 am. £3 entry for adults, children free. Lots of family activities including a 5-a-side football tournament between the police/fire personnel and ex Man City players.

#### It was agreed:

That the police officers be thanks for their attendance and that the information provided be noted.

#### RTF.306 OPEN FORUM

The Chair invited questions/comments and representations from members of the public present at the meeting. The Township Co-ordinator undertook to obtain a reply to matters that could not be dealt with directly at the meeting:-

- John Grayson, local resident and patient at Red Bank addressed the meeting with a number of concerns relating to the withdrawal of the contract for physiotherapy services to a number of local GP practices, by the CCG. John was also supported by Harry Howarth, also a local resident and Dr Flascher, local GP based at Radcliffe Primary Care Centre. John had written to Dr Patel, Chair of the CCG on 30 July detailing his and other residents concerns about the cut to this service and had received an acknowledgment of receipt of the letter, but no formal reply. Councillor Shori reported on his concerns relating to this issue and that he had been contacted by a number of constituents who shared these concerns. Councillor Shori had requested that this matter be considered by the council's Health Scrutiny Committee at a meeting on Tuesday 22 September and Health and Wellbeing Board, on Thursday 24 September, at the Town Hall. The Township Forum were requested to endorse the concerns raised at the meeting and for the issue to be included on the agenda for the next Health and Wellbeing Board and Health Scrutiny meeting.
- Eugene O'Donnell, Chair of Radcliffe Business Group provided feedback on the 'Radcliffe Live' event which had taken place on 1st August in the town centre. The group had investigated the idea of providing funding for the dusk-till-dawn lighting on the cherry trees in the square.

Following a meeting between Eugene and the Head of Street Lighting at Bury Council, a number of health and safety issues were discussed and the group were now investigating the possibility of installing solar powered lighting and the costs involved. Eugene also raised concerns relating to the amount of litter in the Town Centre. Councillor Isherwood gave an assurance that this issue be raised with relevant Council Officers and that the Township Co-ordinator be copied into the response received. Eugene raised the issue of Metolink users taking up car parking spaces in the Town Centre. Councillor Shori reported that the Council could investigate 'hot spots' with the possibility of introducing time restrictions on some parking spaces. It was suggested that this issue be included on the Township Forum Plan as part of an overall Radcliffe Parking Strategy. Eugene also raised concerns about the old Radcliffe Times building, the doors had been left unsecured for days and that he was unaware who was responsible for the building. Councillor Shori stated that it was privately owned but he would inform Six Town Housing.

#### It was agreed:

That, in respect of the decision by Bury Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) to withdraw the contract for physiotherapy services at local GP practices in Radcliffe/Whitefield, members of Radcliffe Township Form request that this the issue be included on the agenda for the next Health and Wellbeing Board meeting on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> September and also to for the item to be considered at a meeting of the Health Scrutiny Committee on Tuesday 22 September.

#### RTF.307 RADCLIFFE TOWNSHIP FORUM PLAN

Christine Maksymowski, Township Co-ordinator presented the draft report which included the issues raised by those who had taken part in the general round table discussions on each of the key priorities contained within the Township Action Plan for 2014/15, for approval by members of the Township Forum.

#### It was agreed:

- 2. That further ideas/comments on the Plan be forwarded to Christine Maksymowski, Township Co-ordinator.

#### RTF.308 ADVISORY GROUP MEMBERS – UPDATE

Colette Jones, Friends of Close Park provided the following update:-

- The recent RSPCA event in the park had been a great success although the 'Friends of...' had been unaware of the event.
- A meeting had been scheduled to take place with the Council regarding the future of the 'Friends of..' Group following the withdrawal of the Rangers Service and to discuss funding issues.

• £500 had been donated by the group towards the volunteer Rangers towards storage provision.

David Lewis, Chapelfield Village Association provided the following update:-

- A trip to Tatton Park to attend the Christmas Fair event had been arranged for residents.
- The leaflet, funded by the 'Our Place' initiative and produced to promote the setting up of the nature reserve and detailing the circular walk was distributed at the meeting.
- People could still attend the photographic exhibition in the Market Hall, aimed at promoting mental health wellbeing, until 17 September.

Carol Kemp, Radcliffe Heritage Society enquired the provision of an allowance to the gardeners at St Mary's to open the toilets and gates to the Tower Heritage site at weekends. Councillor Shori informed the meeting that all options were currently being considered to find a sustainable solution. An update would be provided at the next meeting of the Township Forum.

Gill Stainthorpe, Withins Community Association provided the following update:

• Voluntary Rangers, Rotary and residents had all being involved with clearing saplings around Bury Road. Thanks to the Council for recovering the Green waste. There were plans to hold another event on Sunday 27 September.

Gordon Hartley, representing Ainsworth Community Association informed the meeting that the work undertaken to upgrade the path around Delph had been completed in the past month. The plans to restore the seating area had been put on hold as the grass was no longer being cut.

Councillor Walker reported that the recent fun day event at the new nursery in Radcliffe had raised £500 towards 'Grace's Place'.

#### It was agreed:

That the information provided be noted, with thanks.

Despite the challenging economic climate we continue to strive for improvement, working together with our communities and partner agencies such as the Council, Police and Fire service, health services, faith groups and so on. We have a strong, dedicated, skilled and committed partnership that is working on a range of projects to help us deliver our priorities and improve the quality of life for residents in our community.

Bury Council has a number of key outcomes that underpin its work; delivery of this plan will support these outcomes.

- Reducing poverty and its effects
- Supporting our most vulnerable residents
- Making Bury a better place to live
- One Council, One success together

We would like to thank all our partners and residents for their continued efforts in supporting the Township Forum and the important work it does for the community of Radcliffe.

### Who we are and what we do

Radcliffe Township Forum welcomes those who live, work, or have an interest in the area. The forum meets at local venues such as community venues and schools. These meetings are public meetings and we strongly encourage everyone to come along. Discussions are fed back to Bury Council and its partners for appropriate action.

Radcliffe Township Forum is a constituted council committee consisting of all the elected members representing our area and a co-opted advisory group of local representatives from the business community, voluntary organisations and community groups. There are up to nine members on each Advisory Group and a place is also reserved for a young person's representative.

The Forum empowers our communities, promotes the debate of local issues and brings decision making closer to our residents. It seeks to harness the many strengths and assets we have in place here in Radcliffe, including local groups, strong community networks, talented young people, charities and voluntary groups, to work through these issues as a strong and committed partnership.

### **Some facts about Radcliffe**

**Demography:** Bury has a population of 185,060 (2011 Census Data), of these, approximately 34,189 live in Radcliffe. Radcliffe has a high proportion of the total population 23,800 (71.7%) who are of working age, well above the borough average of 63.9%. Jobseeker Allowance Claimants (JSA) in Radcliffe account for 21.1% of the total claimants in the borough.

**Deprivation:** In terms of measuring deprivation, England is split into small areas called lower super output areas (LSOA). Each LSOA represents approximately 1500 residents. Deprivation is measured over 7 domains: income, employment, health, disability, education and training, barriers to housing and services, living environment and crime. In England there are 32,482 LSOA. In the borough of Bury there are 120 LSOA. Each LSOA is given a ranking, with 1 being most deprived.

Within Radcliffe there are 7 out of the 20 LSOAs in the 25% most deprived in the country. Radcliffe Borough FC/Coronation Road is the most deprived LSAO in Radcliffe. It is within the 5% most deprived in the country overall. There is polarity within the township and deprivation is spatially concentrated around the centre of Radcliffe. Bradley Fold LSOA is within the 20% least deprived LSOA in the country.

**Closing the gap:** Radcliffe has some affluent areas but also pockets of deprivation and high levels of unemployment leading to inequalities which adversely affect the life chances of many people who live in them. These inequalities between our neighbourhoods mean poorer health, lower levels of education and skills, higher crime and unemployment for people living in these areas. The township plan aims to help close the gap so that the lives of those in the most deprived areas are improved.

**Our Assets:** Radcliffe has some beautiful parks and green spaces including Close Park and Outwood Forrest with active and enthusiastic friends groups to ensure that these spaces are well maintained. Radcliffe participates in Bury in Bloom and last year was awarded a gold medal. It has a newly built health centre servicing the whole of Bury. There are active Tenants and Residents Association and Voluntary Organisations that are well represented on the Township Forum.

Radcliffe Township Forum aims to promote better outcomes for the social, health, economic, and environmental well being of people within our community.

We can achieve this by working together to achieve a number of key outcomes:

#### **Improve Community Safety**

Key Issues identified: Youths Involved in Anti Social Behaviour (ASB). Community concerns regarding drug use and acquisitive crime, crime prevention the need to make Radcliffe Safer.

Current Position: Youth Anti Social Behaviour is an issue in some areas of Radcliffe. Drug related acquisitive crime is on the increase

#### **Improved Health and Wellbeing Outcomes**

Key Issues identified: To help improve the health and wellbeing of Radcliffe residents and work across the Children's Centre broad agenda to support children and families.

Current Position: Radcliffe has the highest levels of obesity in Reception Year and Year 6 pupils in the whole of the borough. About 1 in 8 (12%) of Reception Year Children are classified as obese. Almost 1 in 4 (24%) of Year 6 children are classified as obese

#### **Improved Educational Attainment/Learning Opportunities**

Key Issues identified: The need to ensure that children are 'school ready'.

Current Position: Some Nursery School children are well below the expected standards and have poor communication skills.

Radcliffe Township Forum aims to promote better outcomes for the social, health, economic, and environmental well being of people within our community.

We can achieve this by working together to achieve a number of key outcomes:

#### **Community Cohesion, Community Pride and Belonging**

Key Issues identified: To promote the positive side of Radcliffe. To make more use of the parks and open spaces and the need to improve Community Engagement and Town Centre Regeneration.

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### Bury Council Township Forum Report

- Community Cohesion, Community Pride and belonging
- Environmental improvements
