PTF.805 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest

PTF.806 MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

It was agreed:

That the Minutes of the last meeting, held on 25 January 2016, be approved as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

PTF.807 POLICE UPDATE

Sergeant Wightman-Love and Inspector Vicky Shaw provided an update in respect of crime figures in Prestwich. It was reported that following a reconfiguration of shift patterns a new geographical model had been developed. Sixteen Officers in the Prestwich area would be dedicated to neighbourhood response roles.

In response to a question from Jay Lieberman, Sergeant Wightman-Love undertook to look into the future reporting of hate crime statistics.

The Chair, Councillor Black, placed on record her appreciation to those staff leaving the area as part of the reconfiguration of local Police teams.

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Prestwich Township Forum, 10 March 2016

PTF.808 TOWNSHIP UPDATES

Prestwich Parking Strategy

The Chair, Councillor Black, reported that work was ongoing to develop the Prestwich Parking Strategy with a view to being submitted to a future meeting of the Forum.

Mrs Stacey attended the meeting to request residents parking for Bury New Road, outside Heaton Park, as a result of an increase in events at the park and commuter parking.

During discussion of parking, members of the Forum and the public present raised the issue of inconsiderate parking on pavements. In response to a question concerning enforcement action, Councillor Heneghan explained that where there was no parking restriction it was a Police matter if an obstruction was caused.

Prestwich High Street Regeneration

The Chair, Councillor Black reported that the Cabinet had approved plans for Prestwich High Street which included the following key elements:

- wider pavements and the extension of pavements at key crossing points
- improved environment (such as street trees, lighting and paving)
- the provision of single lane running
- bus stop relocation and the provision of bus lay-bys
- provision of parking bays and dedicated cycle lanes

In response to concerns about the safety of proposed cycle lanes, the Chair reported that the Cabinet had agreed to look at issues raised by the cycling community although the scope of what could be done was dependent on cost implications.

It was agreed:

That the updates be noted.

PTF.809 PRESTWICH TOWNSHIP PLAN UPDATE

Ruth Shedwick, Township Co-ordinator, provided an update on the Prestwich Township Plan. It was reported that Village Greens were now included within the plan as it aims to be a community hub for health and wellbeing activities in the area and offer volunteering opportunities.

It was agreed:

That the update be noted.

PTF.810 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

The Chair invited questions, comments and representations from members of the public present at the meeting. Questions were asked and comments made on the issues detailed below. The Township Forum Co-ordinator undertook to obtain a reply to matters which could not be dealt with at the meeting.

- Autumn Depoe-Hughes enquired as to who was responsible for the clean up of Drinkwater Park. David Stanley explained that the Forestry Commission were responsible. Councillor O'Brien referred to the Local Access Forum and highlighted that the Council were responsible for ensuring public footpath access.
- Jay Lieberman raised concerns in respect of the Plough and former Cussons site with regard to damaged railings and general untidiness.
- Mr Stephen Fletcher requested an update on possible traffic calming measures on St Mary's Road. It was explained that the consultation on this issue was underway.

PTF.811 FUNDING UPDATE

The Council has allocated $\pounds 8,000$ to each Township Forum to be allocated through a sub group of the Township forum four times a year in June, September, November and March. A maximum of $\pounds 250$ individual grant is available for formally constituted organisations.

Additionally, a borough-wide allocation of £8,000 is available for "cross-ward" applications for activity that takes place across more than one ward. The "cross-ward" applications are determined by the Council's Small Grants Panel.

The Road Traffic Act 1991 makes the two most serious cycling offences parallel to those of dangerous and careless driving. The maximum fines are currently £2,500 for dangerous cycling and £1,000 for careless cycling.
				As with other offending the Government encourages members of the public to give evidence of specific problems and of particularly dangerous behaviour to the police which will help ensure that the police target their resources effectively.

It is curious that Health & Safety Regulations require erection of temporary meter wide pedestrian walkways when pavements are partially blocked, and yet nothing is done when pavements are completely blocked by motorists. It is curious that there appear to be different rules in London than the rest of the country I'm not sure where the 'policing' of this lies, but as there is a Township Forum meeting tomorrow night where the Police will be present, it would seem appropriate to raise the issue.	Footway parking in Prestwich is enforced if there is a highway restriction attached such as double yellow lines. The restriction is measured from the middle of the road up to the property/boundary line if adopted by the Council. Parking Services enforcement via NSL has no remit to enforce if there is no restriction although GMP could enforce if it is deemed as an obstruction. One caveat is that a number of areas in Prestwich with shops and business areas have canopy properties in which the area immediately outside the shop is private land and therefore we cannot enforce.
