### 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations is the relevant legislation.
- 1.2 The Panel will make a decision on the day of the hearing and the parties will be notified subsequently of the decision and the reasons for it by letter from the Licensing Office.

#### 2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The applicant for the licence in respect of the above premises is Bolanle Oladapo Shodipe, 35 Mona Road, Chadderton, Oldham, OL9 8NS.
- 2.2 The applicant has complied with all the necessary procedural requirements laid down by the Act.
- 2.3 As part of the statutory process the Responsible Authorities and interested parties are entitled to make representations in relation to the grant of a licence. Where representations are made and not withdrawn Members are required to determine them.
- 2.4 Representations must be relevant to the licensing objectives defined within the Act. The objectives are:

The area(s) that are of concern to the Combined Authority are as follows:

Inadequate means of escape

A Fire Safety Evaluation has been carried out on the premises and the means of escape is suitable for no more than 100 people, this has been formulised by way of a restriction order under Article 31 of the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. Greater Manchester Combined Authority have issued this restriction to ensure public safety within the premises, this condition must be adhered to and managed whilst the premises is on use.

In addition, the premises has had certain rooms Prohibited due to excessive travel distance to the only emergency exit from the premises, this Prohibition notice has been served under Article 31 of the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. Greater Manchester Combined Authority have issued this notice to ensure public safety within the premises

Inadequate means of giving warning

During the inspection of the premises there was evidence that the premises was being used for residential accommodation. A Prohibition Order, under Article 31 of the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005, has been served on the premises to prevent the premises from being used as residential accommodation. Greater Manchester Combined Authority have issued this notice to ensure public safety within the premises.

### Other

The ceiling to the main event space is covered in a material that isn't known to be Fire Retardant, as such members of the public are being placed at great risk until the material can be certified or treated with a suitable flame retardant treatment.

In summary, Greater Manchester Combined Authority is in the opinion that the applicant for the licence hasn't taken the necessary actions to safeguard all relevant persons from fire within the premises.

Please could you advise us, at your earliest convenience, the date and time of the Licensing Committee Hearing?

If the relevant areas of concern are addressed and adequate notice is given to the Combined Authority, the representation may be withdrawn.

This letter is without prejudice to enforcing action that the Combined Authority intends to take under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005.



# **Section 3A – The Objectives**

# TO PREVENT CRIME AND DISORDER

Please state your reasons:

Ms Bolanlwe Oladapo Shodipe has applied for a premises licence in respect of Alpha Events Centre, Unit 12B, Britannia Mill, Cobden Street, Bury BL9 6AW.

A meeting has been conducted with the applicant at the premises and we have a number of concerns which are highlighted below.

Ms Shodipe has advised that the premises is to hold up to 400 people for various party events and that the premises licence will allow the venue to be open until 05.30hrs 7 days a week.

Patrons or Hirers will attend with their own food and alcohol. It is with careful consideration that we formally submit our objection to the application.

Greater Manchester Police have concerns that although the application does not request alcohol; the option for patrons to bring their own alcohol and to be able to consume this unregulated in the venue until 05.30hrs gives the potential for disorder to take place. The applicant does not have any licensing experience and does not hold a personal licence.

Given the numbers advised, the security provision stated in the application is not likely to be robust enough and we have noted that the current cctv system does not cover the entirety of the venue and appears to be limited to four cameras.

The venue itself is part of an old mill complex and accessed via a gate from Cobden Street, through a tunnel to a courtyard and internal stone stairs. There is a security door at the top of the landing which is accessed using a serviced door bell. It is not known whether there is adequate lighting or cctv to prevent and detect crime in these areas. The venue is not easily accessed, and there may be a delay in any police response should we be required to attend.

# PUBLIC SAFETY

Patrons can attend with their own alcohol; however there is no provision in place to regulate this. We have concerns that a 05.30hrs licence will allow patrons to obtain high intoxication levels and whilst this can cause issues on a personal level we are concerned that this could impact on members of the public and in turn the wider community should a police response be required.

The venue itself is part of an old mill complex and accessed via a gate from Cobden Street, through a tunnel to a courtyard and internal stone stairs. It is not known whether there is adequate lighting or cctv to prevent and detect crime in these areas.

# TO PREVENT PUBLIC NUISANCE

It is noted that the application does not include the provision for Recorded music. The applicant however confirms that DJ's will be in attendance for parties with the potential to be played until 05.30hrs on any day.

A number of other businesses are located in the building and surrounding area, and lateness of the requested licence is likely to impact them. There is no provision for parking and the applicant advises that patrons use a nearby car park. All local car parks are attached to businesses and it is not clear if permission has been obtained to use them. Any overflow onto surrounding streets is unlikely to be unregulated and has the potential to impact the local community resulting in calls to the police to manage the situation.

# THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

There is no provision in place to prevent children accessing alcohol that has been brought to the venue. With the numbers advised we believe that the consumption of alcohol by children will be difficult to prevent. As well as weddings, the applicant also intends to hire the premises for different types of parties. There is no evidence that should a 18<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> party be held that consumption of alcohol by children will be regulated. The applicant has made reference to "Challenge 25", however this needs to be explained in more depth. If patrons are bringing their own alcohol, at what point are proof of age checks made?

# Section 3B - Suggestions/Further information

We note that the applicant has been using the premises for two years unlicensed and acknowledge that she is now making an effort to rectify this issue by now submitting an application. It is in our opinion that the premises is not suitable in its current state to for hosting events as detailed in the reasons above.

The applicant states that she charges £500 for the room hire and up to £500 for room decorations. She takes about 3 bookings a month; however we believe this is unlikely to provide a viable business in its current state taking overheads into account. We have concerns that the applicant could, without difficulty, make a provision for alcohol within her bookings which would make the business more viable. We have no evidence of this, however we believe that applicant needs to be questioned further by the panel on the validity of the business.

#### BRITANIA MILL UNIT 12B COBDEN STREET BURY BL9 6AN


It is interesting to see an application for licensing has been submitted, given that the premises has already been used for this purpose over the last few weeks. My work premises backs onto COBDEN STREET, and over the last few weekends we have had masses of fly tipping dumped on our land by what can only be the applicant's business. I have no proof that it is this business, apart from all the bags of litter contain large numbers of empty prosecco bottles, cava bottles, vodka bottles and so on.

During work on the applicants premises, we have also had brick work, rubble and wood dumped on our land. This was seen by members of the public, however we have no CCTV footage - something we are now having to invest in given the frequent fly tipping.

I also have strong objections due to deliveries to the applicants premises and parking for their workers and customers. Only this morning did a member of the applicants tell a delivery driver to park on our land at the back of our premises, despite clear signs on the wall saying that it is private land. We have also had numerous people involved with the applicants premises park on our land. There simply is not enough parking in the area to accommodate a premises of this nature in the area during the applied for hours.

I also have strong objections to this given the level of violence and anti-social behaviour involved with such establishments. The premise is inside a large mill, in the back streets and outside of the town centre. There will not be the same police presence as there currently is in Bury town centre to help control any situations of violence and anti-social behaviour. My said premises used to be a Bar and Nightclub before I moved in, and this was shut down due to the level of violence and anti-social behaviour caused. I struggle to believe anything has changed since, and being in the same area there will be the same levels of trouble involved.

I look forward to a response on this.

Hello,

I would like to strongly object to the application for a premises licence that I have just seen on the wall in Cobden Street made by a person called Bola Shodipe for Unit 12B Britannia Mill, Cobden Street Bury. Bl9 6AW.

The back of my store is on Cobden Street and we are already having lots of trouble with the dumping of rubbish and car parking and this will only make things worse.

- 1. Every night we get carrier bags dumped in our car park on Cobden Street containing empty bottles of Prosecco, Vodka bottles, beer bottles, Coca Cola bottles etc. and empty pizza packets and various empty food containers. This happens EVERY night.
- 2. Every day cars park in our car park and go into the mill opposite despite us having No Parking signs displayed on the wall. People just ignore them.
- 3. I have heard very loud music sometimes, at weekends, and cars parked in our car park when there have been weddings and parties going on in the mill.

If this license is given approval things are only going to get worse.

- 1. They will be dumping even more rubbish in our car park.
- 2. Where is everyone going to park? There is already nowhere to park around this area, hence them using our car park all the time. If this person is given a license to open from 11am to 5:30am 7 days a week they won't be able to park anywhere.

I think it is ridiculous to even consider giving a license for these hours when in a mill where people are working and where there are no facilities. If I had a unit in the mill I would be even more annoyed. I can hear music now and we are in a unit across the road. If we were in the same building you wouldn't be able to work.

I would also be very concerned for the security of our building if people are going in and out of this premises all day and night. They already park in out car park and dump rubbish so we know there are people messing around our property in the evenings when we are not there.

This is a working area, not a nightclub area. Please do not allow this application.

# NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

### Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
  holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their
  stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
  Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
  residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
   (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
    of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
    - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
    - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
    - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
  audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
  licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
