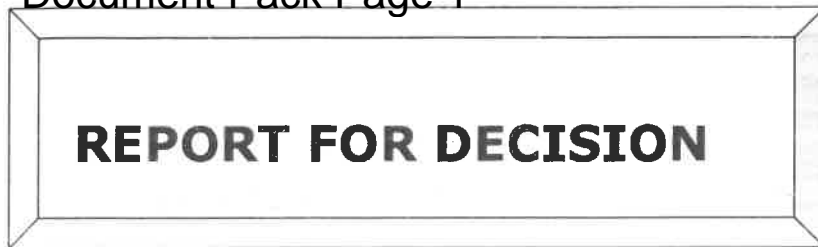

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations is the relevant legislation.
- 1.2 The Panel will make a decision on the day of the hearing and the parties will be notified subsequently of the decision and the reasons for it by letter from the Licensing Office.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The applicant for the licence in respect of the above premises is Mr Lijo Thomas, 13 Evesham Walk, Middleton, M24 1PW. Mr Thomas is also the proposed Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS).
- 2.2 The applicant has complied with all the necessary procedural requirements laid down by the Act.
- 2.3 As part of the statutory process the Responsible Authorities and interested parties are entitled to make representations in relation to the grant of a licence. Where representations are made and not withdrawn Members are required to determine them.
- 2.4 Representations must be relevant to the licensing objectives defined within the Act. The objectives are:-
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - prevention of public nuisance and
 - protection of children from harm

3.0 THE APPLICATION

3.1 The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence under Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003:

Application for a new premises licence

Myles Local, 2a The Parade, Rufford Drive, Whitefield, Bury M45 8PL

Operating schedule/proposed licence conditions

Introduction

This is a small and well-established shop situated within a parade of various shops currently trading as a convenience store/post office selling a range of goods including groceries, soft drinks, cigarettes, dairy goods, newspapers etc.

The applicant (new owner) would just like to add some alcohol sales to allow the business to develop and offer the complete all-round convenience service. The focus of the shop will continue as a general convenience store with the proposed alcohol sales would just be a small part of the overall business.

A detailed and robust operating schedule is proposed to promote the licensing objectives;

Prevention of crime and disorder

A CCTV camera system capable of providing evidential quality images in all lighting conditions shall be used covering the interior and the immediate exterior (entrance) of the shop. Images will be retained for a period of at least 28 days and be made available to the Police upon request within a reasonable time period.

A staff training scheme shall be used for all staff authorised to sell alcohol. The training will cover the importance of preventing under age sales and complying with licence conditions. Refresher training will be provided every 12 months, records will be kept and be made available to responsible authorities

All staff selling alcohol shall be authorised to sell alcohol in writing and a record of the authorisation will be kept in the shop for inspection.

The PLH and staff will be vigilant and monitor the area immediately outside the shop to check that youths do not cause annoyance by congregating.

Spirits will be kept behind the counter.

Any incidents of crime and disorder at or immediately outside the premises, witnessed by staff, will be recorded in an incident book kept at the premises. This book will be kept in the shop and available for inspection.

The premises shall operate a strict alcohol refusals policy - alcohol will not be sold to;

- (1) Any person recognised or identified as a street drinker (regardless of their level of inebriation at the time);
- (2) Any person found to be drinking alcohol in the street;
- (3) Any person who is drunk or appears to be drunk;
- (4) Any person suspected of trying to buy alcohol for another person who is drunk or appears to be drunk;
- (5) Any person unable to provide valid ID when requested by staff;
- (6) Any person who is verbally or physically abusive towards staff or customers.
- (7) To any person suspected of trying to buy alcohol for another person(s) who may be under age.

A notice advising customers of the refusals policy shall be on display.

'Crimestoppers' promotional material will be on display to promote the initiative.

Public safety

Appropriate fire safety equipment to be available, and the PLH shall comply with other legislative requirements to ensure that the shop is safe for customers and staff.

Prevention of public nuisance

Deliveries to the premises will be arranged so as not to cause will not lead to any public nuisance.

Notices shall be on display in the premises asking customers to leave the premises quietly.

Staff will monitor the area immediately outside the premises on a regular basis to check for, and to properly dispose of, any litter from the premises.

Protection of children from harm

The PLH shall ensure that anyone who appears to be under 25 years old who attempts to purchase alcohol will be asked to prove their age by producing an acceptable form of photographic ID such as a passport, photo driving licence, military ID and PASS accredited proof of age cards.

A refusals register (for the sale of alcohol) will be kept and be available for inspection by responsible authorities.

Notices shall be displayed in the premises where they can be seen clearly to advise customers that it is unlawful for persons under 18 to purchase alcohol or for any persons to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under 18 years of age.

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity – such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

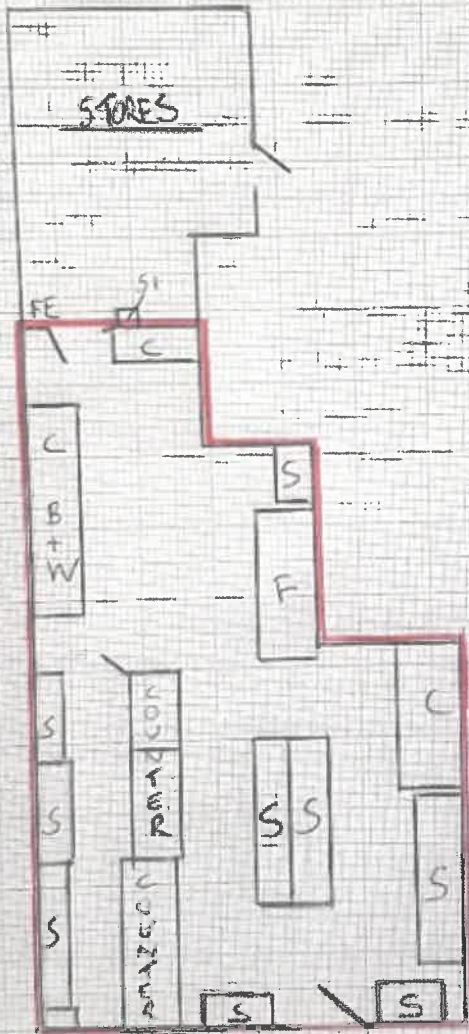

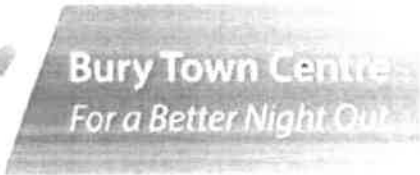

Dear Sir or Madam,

I would like to raise a number of concerns that I have regarding the alcohol licence application for the above.

I live across the road from Rufford Drive Post Office.

It changed hands a couple of years ago, shut down for refurbishments and since it reopened the service, reliability & general operation has been very, very poor.

It (the shop) has quite frankly gone to the wall. It is no longer the essential Post Office and community hub it used to be.

It used to open at 7am. It offered a great service not only as a Post Office but as a newsagent, stationers, greeting card seller & sweet shop, whilst also selling essential groceries such as bread, milk, tea, coffee, sugar etc. This was great for the local community, especially the elderly who would pop in for their morning paper & a pint of milk before 9am.

They no longer act as a newsagent, they no longer sell greeting cards. The very things that they were known for & that local people depended on them for has disappeared. Instead they appeared to diversify by turning the shop into a mobile phone repair & accessory business.

This didn't last long.

The shop became empty again apart from the Post Office service.

As a Post Office it has been closed down at least twice whilst internal Post office investigations took place. The Police were also involved.

I believe that the owners of this shop are also the same owners of the Post Office / Bargain Booze on Manchester Road, which was also temporarily closed down pending internal & police investigations.

This may be one of the reasons that their licence as a National Lottery operator was taken away.

As a Post Office it frequently opens late & closes early. I have put in official complaints about this.

The staffing is inadequate. There is one person serving and queues are often through the door.

A few months ago a friend of mine deposited some money into his bank account via this Post Office & it didn't reach his bank account. Two weeks ago there were some complaints from local people whose debit cards had been cloned. All of them were regular users of this shop to withdraw money.

The accommodation above the shop is currently empty. Until recently it was occupied by upto eight people. It has been raided by the police (whilst under the current owners) and charges were brought for criminal activities.

The application by Mr L. Thomas / Myles Trading is suspicious as the shop is operated by Asians, none of whom have the surname of Thomas.

I would also like to point out that there is a general store / off licence / tobacconist operating two doors away, which is run by Mr & Mrs Singh, who are a much loved & integral part of our local community. Their well established family owned store has served our local community for over 16 years. I can speak from personal experience when I say that the family have been exceptional in their efforts to help the local's, especially the elderly during the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic. They have gone far beyond their roles as shopkeepers and have, at their own personal expense, supported and helped the local people with disability & health problems.

Granting an alcohol licence that is in direct competition to them could be fatal to their business, which has already suffered from the opening of local supermarkets.

Mr & Mrs Singhs shop is open from 9am until 10pm 365 days a year.

There is no need for another shop selling alcohol, especially at the proposed opening hours, 7am until 11pm. 7am is too early, 11pm is too late. These opening hours could cause disruption and anti-social behaviour from alcohol dependent people.

Whilst I feel we should support and encourage our local businesses, the granting of the above licence is not of any benefit to the residents of Rufford Drive and the surrounding community.

I am concerned by the prior criminal investigations and suspicious ongoing activities within the shop & its residential premises.

I therefore urge you in the strongest terms to deny the above licence application.

Thanks for your email, all noted.

In answer to your queries;

1. Yes, Mr Thomas will be working in the shop full time as the designated premises supervisor. Of course, there will be times when he isn't there – for example going to the wholesalers, holidays, etc. He will be the responsible person in terms of alcohol sales from the shop.
2. The post office part is separate to Mr Thomas, the post office will continue to be run by the same person independent from Mr Thomas. Mr Thomas is responsible for the general convenience part of the business including the proposed alcohol sales.
3. I can reiterate that Mr Thomas has only taken on the lease for the shop part of the business. He has absolutely no involvement with the flat above.
4. The shop will continue to be a general convenience store selling a range of goods – alcohol sales would just be a part of the overall business.
5. People who have confirmed that they support the shop/licence application are from a number of streets in the area including Rufford Drive. The Council have advised that the only objection that they have received from a local resident is your letter. I am not aware of any petition.
6. Mr Thomas is a genuine and responsible person and will make sure that the shop – with alcohol sales – would run well. The licence conditions we have proposed are comprehensive and would promote the licensing objectives. These include CCTV, a refusals register and a strict alcohol refusals policy, etc. The Police are satisfied that a licence can be issued, as are all of the other responsible authorities including the Licensing Authority, Trading Standards, etc.

Thank you for your letter of 19th August 2020 regarding the above.

I would like to address some of your points as follows:

The applicant, Mr Lijo Thomas is the personal licence holder and the designated premises supervisor. Please can you clarify the extent of Mr Thomas's involvement in the shop. Will he be there every day to fulfil his role as licence holder / premises supervisor?

The Post Office is still being operated by the same person that has been there for the last couple of years. Is this person independent & not employed by Mr Thomas as the proprietor of the shop?

The landlord of the building leases it as a whole, including the flat above. I have personally witnessed anti-social activities from the flat, which have involved the police. Can you categorically confirm that Mr Thomas and / or his business partners do not have any responsibility or business interests for the flat?

The feedback you mention from the local community consists of 77 signatures, all of whom I suspect are Post Office customers and not local residents from The Elms Estate. I would be interested to see the postal addresses of these people.

I believe that there are over 200 signatures from LOCAL people objecting to the proposed licence.

I am well aware of the regulations and conditions attached to granting an alcohol licence, however there are other factors that must be considered.

Within our local community there are a number of one-bedroom flats, many of which are occupied by alcohol / drug dependent / mentally ill people. Some of these residents are known by the police for their anti-social behaviour.

The off licence two doors from the Post Office have a zero-tolerance policy. They have been very successful in ridding the community of some of these awful people by their vigilance, refusals to sell & banning troublesome people from their shop.

I am greatly concerned that the introduction of a new off licence will be frequented by some of these anti-social people and cause distress to myself and my neighbour's.

I live directly opposite the shop and have been a customer for many years. It will be nice to finally see it back as the thriving business it once was, as a Post Office & Newsagent.

But it will not be a newsagent.

Instead, if the licence application is granted it will become an off licence, which is of no benefit to the local community & is potentially a troublesome tinder box for myself and my neighbours.
