2. Introduction / Background

Joint Strategic Needs Assessments (JSNAs) are assessments of the current and future health and social care needs of the local community. – these are needs that could be met by the local authority, CCGs, or the NHS Commissioning Board.

An update of the planned actions around the JSNA was provided to the Board at the December meeting. Since then there has been significant progress in the development of the JSNA. Based on the consultation and feedback the JSNA has now been developed into a

- Web based resource
- Point for exchange of data, information, reports
- Series of standard chapters and documents
- Resource closely linked to Bury assets / Directory

The JSNA has been developed in such a way that it will be a continually evolving resource. It will be regularly updated and added to by key partners. This will be done through an iterative process dependent on the needs and requirements of Team Bury partners. The key purpose of the JSNA is to support work plans and future commissioning needs and to capture community engagement.

Over the last couple of months the JSNA has been trialled with members from several key groups/Boards who will be regular users and contributors to the content. Feedback from these groups has been provided and as a result a range of amendments to the content and format have been made. In addition a number of processes have been refined to ensure the both contributing to, and obtaining information from the JSNA is as simple as possible.

3. key issues for the Board to Consider

In this current climate of reduced capacity both in time and money we want

- To help all partners use best intelligence to allow them to make best use of resources
- To exchange of valuable intelligence and information
- Commitment to ensure that the content of the JSNA will become richer over time
- To maximise the use of qualitative as well as quantitative data to understand the drivers of behaviour, felt need and local community assets.
- To enable us to better understand potential future needs as well as needs in the here and now
- To bring together analytical expertise from across the partnerships
- To understand what questions local stakeholders would like to have answered about local needs and assets
- The JSNA to be a real driver and enabler of joined up solutions to improve outcomes for our population.

Development of the JSNA is now at a point where we feel we have a dynamic, accessible product that shares intelligence to support commissioners and decision makers. A JSNA operational group has been established and we have ongoing engagement with all key stakeholders. A range of local information, data and analysis has also now been added. In addition a commitment has been reached by all key partners to continually support the process of updating and uploading key information/data to the JSNA.

The next step in the JSNA development is holding an official launch. This would act to highlight to the public and wider partners what the JSNA is, what it is used for and how it will benefit Bury residents. Assuming the Board's agreement - this is provisionally planned for the last week in May. Further details to launch will be put together and shared with the board once this has been agreed.
