### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations are the relevant legislation.
- 1.2 The Panel will make a decision on the day of the hearing and the parties will be notified subsequently of the decision and the reasons for it by letter from the Licensing Office.
- 1.3 Up to 6<sup>th</sup> April 16, the Premises Licence in respect of Pics was held by Pics Bar Bury Limited. According to a check of Companies House register, Mrs Clare Clarke of the same address was a sole director for the company. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) is a Miss Alexandra Clarke, 14 Sleaford Close, Brandlesholme, Bury, BL8 1XF.

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 During the check of the Companies House register, it was also established that Pics Bar Bury Limited had been dissolved on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2016. Section 27 (1)(d) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that "a Premises Licence lapses if the holder of the licence is dissolved". However, s50 of the Act makes provision for the licence to be re-instated if an application to transfer the licence under the provisions of s42 & 43(1)(a) is received within 28 days of the licence lapsing.

- 2.2 On the 24<sup>th</sup> March 2016, the Licensing Service received an application from The Dog House Bury Limited, registered address, 36 Market Street, Bury, for the licence to be transferred to the company and to have 'immediate effect'. Mrs Clare Clarke is also the Company Director of The Dog House Bury Limited. Miss Alexandra Clarke has been retained as the DPS in respect of the licence. She is also the Company Secretary for The Dog House Bury Limited.
- 2.3 There was already a separate Premises Licence in force in relation to 36 Market Street, (currently called 'Blue'- which is a licensed Turkish Kebab House). The Premises Licence is also held by The Dog House Bury Limited. Miss Alexandra Clarke is also the DPS in relation to 'Blue'.
- 2.4 An objection notice in relation to the transfer application was received from Greater Manchester Police on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2016. As this was received one day outside the 14 day period during which such a Notice can be given, it was rejected by the Licensing Authority and the licence was transferred to The Dog House Bury Limited in accordance with the legislation.

### 3.0 PROCEDURE

- 3.1 In relation to the review application, the applicant has complied with all the necessary procedural requirements laid down by the Act.
- 3.2 As part of the statutory process the Responsible Bodies and interested parties are entitled to make representations in relation to the review of a licence. The Licensing Authority has given Notice of the application by placing a Notice on the premises, at the Council Offices and on the Council web site. Where further representations are made by either the Responsible Authorities or from local residents / businesses and not withdrawn, Members are required to determine them.
- 3.3 Representations must be relevant to the licensing objectives defined within the Act. The objectives are:
  - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) prevention of public nuisance and
  - d) protection of children from harm

### 4.0 CURRENT LICENSABLE ACTIVITIES

- 4.1 The current licensable activities are as follows:
  - a. The Supply of alcohol For consumption on & off the premises:

Monday – Sunday 11.00 – 04.00hrs Bank holidays 11.00 – 04.00hrs

b. The Provision of Regulated Entertainment comprising:

Recorded music:

Monday – Sunday 11.00 – 04.00hrs Bank holidays 11.00 – 04.00hrs c. Performance of live music:

Monday – Sunday 11.00 – 02.00hrs Bank holidays 11.00 – 02.00hrs

d. <u>Provision of late night refreshment:</u>

Monday – Sunday 23.00 – 04.00hrs Bank holidays 23.00 – 04.00hrs

e. The Opening hours of the premises:

# 5.0 REPRESENTATIONS FROM GREATER MANCHESTER POLICE

- 5.1 Greater Manchester Police, in their capacity as a Responsible Authority, will shortly give their reasons for their application for a review of the Premises licence in which they request the Panel to consider revoking the licence. If the Panel is not minded to revoke the licence, they are requested to consider:
  - a. Remove the current DPS from the licence (Miss Alexandra Clarke).
  - b. Direct that the current door staff/security company be changed.
  - c. To modify the licence by reducing the timings for licensable activities and the time that the premises is open to the public as detailed at appendix 1.

#### 6.0 OTHER REPRESENTATIONS

- **6.1** Three representations have been received from interested parties. The grounds of their representations are summarised as follows:
  - Crime and Disorder
  - Doorstaff out of control
  - No need for the venue to be open until 04.00
  - Drug dealing inside the premises

#### 7.0 OBSERVATIONS

7.1 After hearing the representations made in relation to the Review Application, Members are obliged to determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives and having regard to the Authority's Licensing Policy and National Guidance.
