#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations is the relevant legislation.
- 1.2 The Panel will make a decision on the day of the hearing and the parties will be notified subsequently of the decision and the reasons for it by letter from the Licensing Office.

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The premises licence was surrendered under Section 28 of the Licensing Act 2003, on the 21<sup>st</sup> September 2017 by the previous owner Mr Pishtiwan Jaza Mohammed.
- 2.2 Section 50(1)(b) permits the reinstatement by transfer where a premises licence lapses by virtue of Section 28.
- 2.3 On the 26<sup>th</sup> September 2017 an application to transfer the premises licence was made by Mr Hallo Omid.
- 2.4 A representation to this application was made by Greater Manchester Police and the application was subsequently refused at a Hearing on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2017.
- 2.5 Section 50(6) states that the licence lapses again when the applicant is notified of the rejection of the application. Section 50(7) states that 'only one application for transfer of a premises licence may be made in reliance on this section'.

- 2.6 Therefore any further applications must be for the Grant of a New Premises Licence. An application for such was received on the 14<sup>th</sup> December 2017.
- 2.7 The applicant for the licence in respect of the above premises is Polka Limited of 20 Parkhills Road, Bury, BL9 9AX of which Ranja Jamal is the sole director. Shamal Qadir of 16 Lidget Terrace, Lidget Green, Bradford, BD7 2LR is the proposed Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS).
- 2.8 The applicant has complied with all the necessary procedural requirements laid down by the Act.
- 2.9 As part of the statutory process the Responsible Authorities and interested parties are entitled to make representations in relation to the grant of a licence. Where representations are made and not withdrawn Members are required to determine them.
- 2.10 Representations must be relevant to the licensing objectives defined within the Act. The objectives are:
  - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - b) public safety
  - c) prevention of public nuisance and
  - d) protection of children from harm

#### 3.0 THE APPLICATION

3.1 The application is for the grant of a Premises Licence under Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003:
