Details of Operational Decision Taken [with reasons]:

The SCO post has been vacant since previous worker left the Council (Oct 2017). The complexity of work now required within the Acute Hospital setting means a need for more qualified workers able to undertake legal processes of mental capacity assessments, safeguarding processes, and overall complexity of casework needing that level of qualification. It is my intention in converting the role to SW ASYE to support provision of an additional social worker on the team. The ASYE role would mean annual recruitment to the 12 month ASYE programme (SW post-qualifying assessed and supported process), thus enabling a potential annual development opportunity within this team for students qualifying post-placement within Bury, thus supporting the 'Grow Your Own' ethos within Adult Care, whilst also supporting succession planning in the team/ Authority.

Cost of an SCO post is £25,951 and the ASYE is £29,323, leaving a shortfall of £3372. The SCO post has been vacant since November 2017 and there is an additional 2 days SCO post vacancy ongoing (saving of £10,380 minus additional cost of converting to ASYE of £3372 = £7,008).
