TEMPORARY CLOSURE: FOOTWAY BRANDLESHOLME ROAD, BURY

STATEMENT OF JUSTIFICATION

A request has been received from Bury Council, Engineering Consultancy regarding the possibility of extending the temporary closure of the footway of Brandlesholme Road, Bury to enable replacement of damaged pedestrian guardrailing and parapet works.

Whilst a contract had been awarded for the works to be carried out, the successful contractor experienced delays whilst carrying out other work for the Council. The works were initially reprogrammed, but this would have meant works being carried out on the approach to Christmas, which was undesirable given that Brandlesholme Road is a key route into the town centre.

The footway has yet to be closed under the current closure and thus has remained accessible to the public, and will continue to be accessible until the works start. Arrangements are being made and it is hoped that the works will now be carried out in the new year before the end of March 2019 and a closure will be required to facilitate the works.

In view of the above the an extension of 6 months is requested.
