STATEMENT OF COUNCIL'S JUSTIFICATION

TM2/19/450:- QUEENS DRIVE, PRESTWICH

Concerns have been raised regarding parking problems on Queens Drive, particularly on the bend between Sedgley Park Road and Rochester Avenue.

There is a regular demand for on street parking in this area generated by a number of sources in the area, namely the Police Training College, Beis Hamedrash Shaarei Mordechai Synagogue, Yesoiday Hatorah Primary School and residential properties. In addition to parking in the area, Queens Drive does provide a well used route for through traffic between Bury New Road and Kings Road and vice versa and there is the associated traffic to the school and synagogue etc.

The junction of Queens Drive with Sedgley Park Road is currently protected by double yellow lines. When parking is at its busiest, Queens Drive is reduced to a single lane of traffic which can cause congestion and due to the amount of parking there is little opportunity for through traffic to pull in to allow opposing traffic to pass. As Queens Drive has a layout of a sweeping curve, drivers have restricted visibility and drivers are often committed to passing parked cars before they can perhaps see opposing traffic. This can result in complete gridlock of the road and can on occasion lead to confrontations between drivers. In addition to the congestion and resulting inconvenience to drivers some of the parking can lead to pedestrians having to go into the road to continue their passage along Queens Drive, leading to a potentially unsafe situation for pedestrians

Mindful of the fact that there will be a continuing demand for parking in the area, the extent of the proposal has been kept to a minimum, but the proposal does reflect what is considered to be reasonable in order to improve and assist traffic flows in the area to alleviate current issues being experienced.

There is likely to be additional demand for parking in the area as there are proposals for an extension to the Parkgates Complex. The restrictions should assist visibility from the Police Training College and ensure that there is no pinch point in the vicinity of the Synagogue and Police College.

This was discussed by the Traffic Management Unit at its meeting of 29 January 2019, the decision being to recommend the introduction of No Waiting at Any time restrictions on Queens Drive and the junction of Rochester Avenue in order to facilitate traffic movements and maintain visibility.

The extent of the proposed restrictions are described in the accompanying schedule.





South side, from a point 10m northwest of the westerly kerbline of Rochester Ave to a point 10m east of the easterly kerbline of Rochester Ave

Rochester Ave, Prestwich - Both sides from the southerly kerbline of Queens Dr for a distance of 10m in a southerly direction
