Details of Operational Decision Taken [with reasons]:

In 2018 the Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA) and Greater Manchester Health and Social Care Partnership (GMHSCP) approved a new GM Learning Disability Strategy. The strategy contains 10 priority areas which aim to improve health and social care outcomes.

The Bury Learning Disability Strategy has been refreshed to ensure it aligns to the GM priorities, whilst also reflecting local needs. An action plan is in development to implement the strategy.

A new infrastructure is being put in place to help deliver our ambitions for Bury. This includes:

The Bury Learning Disability Co-production Network – comprising of people with learning disabilities (also known as experts by experience), their families, carers and advocates, and health and social care senior leads

The Bury Learning Disability Delivery Group – comprising health and social care senior leads





As a result of these changes, a provider is needed to organise and run the Bury Learning Disability Co-production Network; by facilitating quarterly workshops. The workshops will be informal meetings in community venues. The aim is to engage people with learning disabilities, their families, carers and advocates; and senior leads.

The network will initially be for adults, with the long term plan being to establish an all age network. The maximum budget, for a 12 month pilot, is £7,500.

Quotations for a provider were invited in line with Contract Procedure Rules via The Chest e-tendering system. The opportunity was published on The Chest on 30 September 2019 with a closing time and date of 5pm on Friday 18 October 2019
