### Background

As part of managing the COVID 19 pandemic, Bury Council has made offers of support to Providers across Bury, which encompasses several aspects; for example, access to and funding of PPE; access to and funding of staff. However, there is a recognition that, due to the exceptional nature of the current circumstances arising from C19, there may be other, unforeseen expenditure e.g. inflated costs or other expenditure which is incurred for the purpose of keeping operational services running safely.

Hence, the proposal to implement the Exceptional Expenditure Fund, which allows for the fact that we cannot foresee and be specific about all types of expenditure which may be incurred, despite our best efforts.

#### Proposal

A draft application form has been developed that is embedded within this report. It outlines the basic scope of the Fund, and the process of applying.



The COVID Provider Offer previously agreed included offers to support areas such as PPE and staffing that were clearly going to be significant pressures for Providers. The offer also included an offer of support for unforeseen expenditure associated with the COIVD-19 pandemic. It was felt important to include an offer of additional support in light of the difficulty in forecasting the potential impacts on other areas of our Providers' business. This utilised the COVID-19 fund allocated to Bury Council/CCG.

There is basic criteria which must be met, for example money awarded is to be used **ONLY** for purposes for which it is granted, any unspent money must be returned to the Council etc, however, there is no additional criteria which specifies what the

money must/must not be spent on. Whilst this is unusual, it recognizes the exceptional nature of the circumstances the Providers find themselves in.

#### Decision

Support is required for the approach outlined above. We aim for this project to be up and running within one week of approval so Providers can receive the additional support as soon as possible.
