

<p><b>Summary:</b></p> <p>Temporary closure under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, of Bolton Street, Bury, northerly side footway/cycleway between Crostons Road and the subway at the junction of Bolton Street and Peel Way from Monday 18/01/21 for a period of 3 months to facilitate electrical works (anticipated duration of works 4 weeks). The diversion route for pedestrians and dismounted cyclists is via Bolton Street, southerly side footway.</p>
