Summary:

Accept the lowest tender in the sum of \pounds 346,060.08 submitted by T J Murphy Ltd, Moss Lane, Off Sharp Street, Worsley, Greater Manchester, M28 3LY. Scheme funded by GMCA.

Options considered: None.

Decision: [with reasons]

The Growth Deal projects for junction improvements Angouleme Way/Market Street (Op Dec 312) and Wash Lane/M66 Jnc 2 (this Op Dec) were included in the refreshed capital programme that went before Cabinet in November 2020.

Growth Deal schemes are funded by the Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA).

Council funding had been sought to make up a funding gap that had appeared due to a higher than anticipated tender return value. Work by officers from Bury and Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) has managed to access external funding to bridge this shortfall via the Active Travel Fund given that this scheme will bring great benefits to active travel in the area. Consequently, this element of Council funding is no longer required.

GMCA funding has been confirmed and was subject to business case review including value for money by TfGM Growth Deal team on behalf of the GMCA and has been through their governance process. The business case is attached for information. Also attached is the GMCA report where the approval for the financing of this scheme was given.

The scheme decreases journey times to those highway users exiting Bury in the direction towards Rochdale and the M66. The main savings will be experienced by users of the Wash Lane approach. The queue length has fallen from an average of 91m to 42m in the AM peak and from 158m to 47m in the PM peak. This represents a reduction in delay in the AM peak from an average 31 seconds to 14 seconds and for the PM peak from 59 seconds to 13 seconds. As the time saving has been achieved by the provision of additional carriageway, this has not come at the expense of the other arms of the junction.

The benefit to cost ratio (BCR) has been calculated at 8.39. The value for money assessment of the scheme is, therefore, classed as "very high" given that the BCR is greater than 4.

The tendering process was compliant with Contract Procedure Rules & Financial Regulations and was an open tender undertaken via The Chest procurement portal.

It is recommended to accept the lowest tender in the sum of \pounds 346,060.08 submitted by T J Murphy Ltd, Moss Lane, Off Sharp Street, Worsley, Greater Manchester, M28 3LY.
