Summary:

Subsequent to TMU approval in May 2019 as an AOB item, to approve for implementation a 'Safer Streets Save Lives' (SSSL) scheme on the B6214 Lumb Carr Road / Helmshore Road through Holcombe Village.

Options considered:

The proposed introduction of these facilities forms part of the 'Safer Streets Saves Lives' initiative coordinated by Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM). The monies provided under SSSL are effectively an 'Emergency' Covid 19 funding initiative.

This initiative aims to support social distancing during coronavirus lockdown and recovery with £500,000 of funding being made available from this funding pot by TfGM for GM Districts as part of the MCF walking and challenge funding pot.

The proposed scheme for Lumb Carr Road / Helmshore Road will improve road safety (particularly for pedestrians). Three new pedestrian refuge crossing points are proposed as part of the scheme along with other safety measures. The Holcombe area has become very popular with walkers during the Covid 19 pandemic and the proposed scheme should improve safety for the increase in pedestrian activity in the locality.
