Summary:

The pilot project at St Marys Park has proven to be successful and Bury Live Well Service (Operations) is now in a position to scale up project management for tennis court re-development and access system investment in our green flag community parks.

Phase one is now complete with community park tennis courts now upgraded at Nuttall Park, Whitehead Park, Manchester Road Park, Hamilton Road Park, Bolton Road Park and Openshaw Park.

Re-development

Following a competitive tender process via The Chest and subsequent evaluation of the submitted quotations, the lowest cost for the tennis court refurbishment works is accepted as providing best overall value to the authority.

It is recommended that Groundwork Landscapes Ltd of Top o'th Moor Farm, Bury, BL8 4NR is awarded the contract at Town Meadow park, Close Park and Clarence Park with the total value of capital works at valued at £177,332.09.

Access System

Bury Council's long-standing partnership with The Lawn Tennis Association (LTA) has helped to secure external funding for the access gates and installations.

The LTA has worked in conjunction with CIA Fire & Security Ltd in expanding its established online club system (clubspark) by integrating authorised access control on tennis courts. The total value of this work is estimated at $\pm 17,250$ and is it anticipated that this will be grant funded by the LTA (funding application submitted for Clarence Park; business case submitted for Close Park and Town Meadow Park).

It is recommended that PRE-Electrical Solutions Ltd of Unit 1/Peel Ind. Est./Chamberhall Street, Bury, BI9 0LU supply and install the connection units. The total value of this works is estimated at \pounds 3,244.49 (formal quotation received for Town Meadow park and Close Park with Clarence Park pending).

Technical Services

It is recommended that Bury Councils Streetscene Maintenance - Operations provides the technical services required for both the tender review and the scope of works, with a total value estimated at \pounds 8,866.60

Capital Investment

A total of £5,305 funding has been identified for capital investment at Town Meadow Park through section 106 and £35,000 has been secured through capital receipt monies for Clarence Park.
