# STATEMENT OF COUNCIL'S JUSTIFICATION

## <u>TM2/21/492:- Un-named Access Road leading to Rose</u> <u>Court, Radcliffe (off Water Street)</u>

A request has been received for consideration to be given to the introduction of No Waiting at Any time restrictions on the Un-named Access Road Leading to Rose Court Nursing Home, Radcliffe.

In addition to providing access to the Care Home, it also provides access to businesses located at Albert Works and Waterside House, and to the recently redeveloped former British Legion Site which now has a residential use.

Water Street is protected by an existing No Waiting 8am – 7pm and peak hour loading restrictions. Double yellow lines are currently marked out on the unadopted section of the access road, which are not supported by a TRO and not intended to be incorporated into a proposed TRO.

Some parking has been observed at this location mainly on the footway adjacent to the short unrestricted section, which would appear to be vehicles associated with the development of the former British Legion Site. Whilst this construction parking is temporary and will dissipate once the development is completed, it is thought that there is the potential for parking to take place in this location going forward with the potential to impact on vehicle access.

This report was circulated to the Traffic Management Unit members for 26 January 2021, the decision being to recommend the introduction of No Waiting at Any time restrictions on the Un-named Access Road leading to Rose Court, Radcliffe to alleviate access and obstruction problems.

The extent of the proposed restrictions are described in the accompanying schedule.

Un-named Access Rd Leading to Rose Court Nursing Home, Radcliffe (off Water St) – both sides from the northerly kerbline of Water St for the remainder of the adopted highway in a northerly direction (approx. 14m)
