

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## **STATEMENT OF COUNCIL'S JUSTIFICATION**

### **TM2/21/508 — RECTORY AVENUE/RECTORY GROVE/RECTORY LANE, PRESTWICH**

Residents have reported that vehicles parking on Rectory Avenue on its junction with Rectory Grove are blocking access for refuse collection vehicles accessing Rectory Grove.

The obstruction is preventing refuse bins being collected. Indeed the refuse collection team have confirmed that there is an ongoing issue with refuse collection.

To alleviate these problems it is proposed to introduce no waiting at any time restrictions as indicated in the schedule below. Residents at the proposed location have off-street parking and these restrictions will also alleviate driveway obstruction issues which can also be a problem for local residents.

Vehicles also park well over the footway which can cause access problems for pedestrians, especially those with mobility problems and people with buggies and prams.

In addition, parking on Rectory Lane at its junction with Rectory Avenue can cause access and visibility problems for junction users and it would also seem appropriate at this time to propose parking restrictions at this junction to alleviate these problems.

This report was circulated to the Traffic Management Unit members for comments on Tuesday 27 July 2021, the decision being to recommend the introduction of no waiting at any time restrictions to alleviate access and obstruction.

The extent of the proposed restrictions are described in the accompanying schedule.

#### **Schedule**

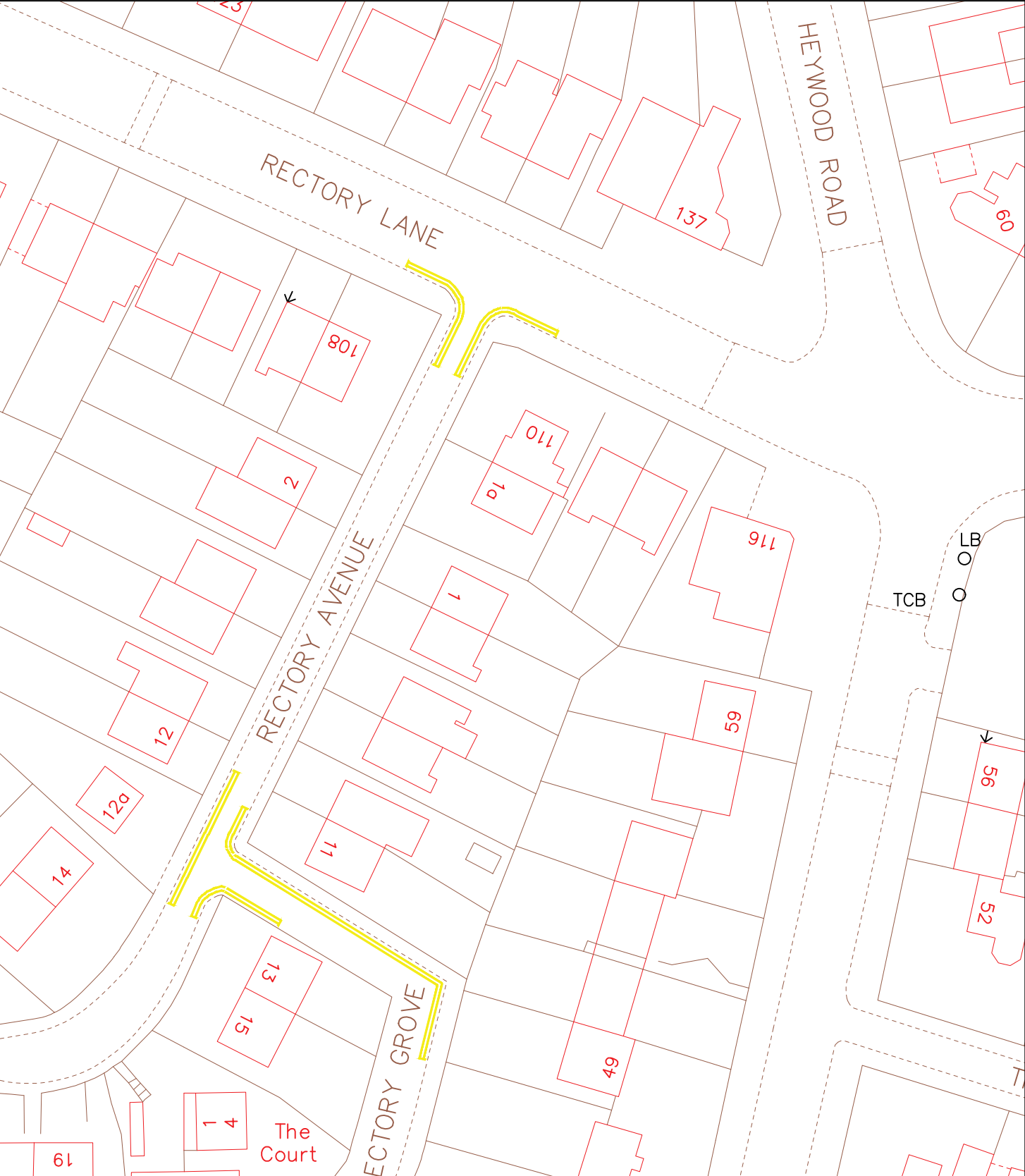
##### **Proposed No Waiting at Any time**

Rectory Lane, Prestwich – Southerly side, from a point 10 metres west of the westerly kerbline of Rectory Avenue to a point 10 metres east of the easterly kerbline of Rectory Avenue

Rectory Avenue, Prestwich – Both sides, from the southerly kerblines of Rectory Lane for a distance of 10 metres in a southerly direction. West side, from a point 7 metres north of the projected northerly kerblines of Rectory Grove for a distance of 15 metres in a southerly direction. East side from a point 5 metres north of the northerly kerblines of Rectory Grove to a point 5 metres south of the southerly kerblines of Rectory Grove.

Rectory Grove, Prestwich – North side, from the easterly kerblines of Rectory Avenue for a distance of 31 metres in an easterly direction. East side, from its northerly kerblines for a distance of 10 metres in a southerly direction. South side from the easterly kerblines of Rectory Avenue for a distance of 10 metres in an easterly direction.
