STATEMENT OF COUNCIL'S JUSTIFICATION TM2/21/510 — CHARLES STREET, WHITEFIELD

An incident of a vehicle parking over the footway causing access and obstruction problems for a mobility scooter on Charles Street, Whitefield was reported to Christian Wakeford MP and subsequently passed to Traffic with a request to investigate the issue.

Observations have been carried out and footway parking occurs both sides of Charles Street; outside Victoria Community Centre and along the opposite pavement.

As it is double parking that is causing the problem, if one side of the carriageway can be protected with yellow lines on this section of Charles Street, there would be no longer be any reason for drivers to park on the none restricted side partly over the footway. This proposal will ensure that both pavements will be clear of overriding vehicles and provide unobstructed access for pedestrians and people with mobility issues.

In addition, restrictions will facilitate access for pedestrians and wheelchair users to the Community Centre. They will also ease vehicular access to and from Victoria Square.


