<p>Summary:</p> <p>Currently We have a contract for an Electronic Monitoring System (ECM) for Reablement team. This is currently going to end in July 2024. With the renewal being a lot higher than previous contract. We have reviewed our service requirements, and it was identified that the current system does not meet our requirements. It was also identified that we would also like an ECM system to cover our Rapid Response service and not just Reablement service.</p> <p>ECM is very important in supporting allocations/scheduling/lone working and capacity and demand.</p>

Decision

Rapid Response and Reablement aims to increase the number of people we can support. We recognise that capacity in areas across the community can impact on the number of admissions. With an effective ECM system in place, the work will be allocated effectively saving time and mileage for staff, as well as improving the flow through the service.

Option 1, Is inefficient and is currently not working.

Option 2, We felt with a small budget and time restraints that this was not an appropriate route to market.

Option 3, We felt this was the best option due to budget, and with this also being within the contract procedure rules, this may be the quickest option due to time constraints and notice given to current provider,

From the evaluation it is determined that Nourish Care Planner meets all requirements for ECM for Reablement and Rapid response where the other providers don't.

They are also well within budget for 1 year saving £4,898 per year whilst the nearest competitor for requirements is £42,408 over budget per year.

For a 3-year contract, if went with Nourish Care Planner we will save a total of £14,694.00 Whilst the nearest competitor we would be above budget by £124,770.00.

It is therefore recommended that approval is granted to.

Procure the Nourish Care Planner system to manage the electronic care monitoring of customers in Rapid Response and Reablement. This will be procured via the SBS Framework.

1. Purpose of Document

- The purpose of this document is to obtain permission to procure the Nourish Care Planner system to manage the electronic care monitoring of customers in Rapid Response and Reablement.

2. Overview

Rapid Response is currently allocating visits based on general knowledge of the area and postcodes. Staff are often travelling far in between visits. The service has no oversight of where the staff are and how long visits are taking. Referrals are often declined due to capacity, but we have no evidence to justify this decision.

Reablement has an ECM system in place which doesn't allow the service to oversee staff throughout the day. There is no capacity and demand report available to assist with allocations. The system does not allow automatic scheduling when staff are on leave or sick, meaning there is a lot of admin time involved.

3. Proposal

The aspiration is for Rapid Response and Reablement to use an electronic care monitoring system. This will support more accurate allocations and inform the service of gaps to allocate new visits. The system will stop inappropriate declines based on capacity. With a system across both services, staff can be flexed across the teams where required to ensure the most appropriate use of resources.

I am therefore proposing to procure a new system which will meet the specifications for Rapid Response and Reablement. It will allow for better allocations and reduce unnecessary mileage costs.

4. Costings

Three quotes have been received from interested parties.

5. Financial Implications

The current annual budget for the ECM system is £18,000. However, due to the price increases for the current ECM system the 23/24 annual cost was £29,962. This is £11,962 over budget. The new system will come in £4,898 under budget per annum.

The current system also charges the council based on the number of customers using the service at any time, meaning the costs can fluctuate, and this doesn't support us with our aim of increasing customers through the service.

The new system charges the council based on the number of licenses for access to the system, and the number of staff. Even if we doubled the number of staff in the service, the costs would not exceed the budget.

6. Staffing Implications

This decision has no implications on staffing.

7. Recommendation

Rapid Response and Reablement aim to increase the number of people we can support. We recognise that capacity in areas across the community can impact on the number of admissions. With an effective ECM system in place, the work will be allocated effectively saving time and mileage for staff, as well as improving the flow through the services.
