

They took this job over from the police and as far as we know, only work 9 to 5. People know that they can get away with anything, as per photos previously submitted.</li> <li>How many enforcement officers in Bury, broken down by Township Forums?</li> <li>What hours do they work?</li> <li>Can serious consideration be given to my suggestion about having self-employed parking wardens?</li> </ol>	Parking dept	I will ask NSL for additional enforcement within residents only zones in Whitefield. However I can confirm that the area is attended on a regular basis by the number of complaints/appeals we receive from residents & appellants alike. There have been 125 pcns issued (for the residents only zone at Hamilton Road) in 2015 to 31st October to support the previous statement.  The residential areas that are not Residents Only zones are only enforced if there are restrictions to enforce such as double yellow lines. NSL do not enforce general parking matters if there is no restriction.  Because Whitefield is such a concentrated area for restrictions the enforcement is already carried out by vehicle & scooter. There are 2 enforcement shifts (7am-4pm & 10am-7pm) Monday-Saturday which covers the Residents Only parking of 8am-8pm Monday-Saturday.  Enforcement is carried out by 12-14 CEOs deployed daily over the 2 shifts but the Borough is split into a number of areas for enforcement and not by Township.  There is no intention to recruit self-employed CEOs and certainly not to pay them via an incentive scheme. This would lead to the Council being accused of creating PCN targets which is not the aim of Traffic Management Act 2004 (TMA 2004).  John Foudy
